

# USS Massachusetts Fall River, MA Radar Picket Ships Dedication


We will be dedicating our exhibit onboard the Battleship assachusetts on Wednesday May 29, 2002. For those of you who will be wearing your uniforms, dress blues with ribbons is suggested. And as a reminder to the women, going up and down ladders can be tricky, so wear comfortable shoes.

#### **Onboard Work**

It has been a busy time on the Massachusetts. We have installed the 16 signs (one for each ship) and a display case for one of our models. A lot of miscellaneous items are also being taken care of with a few additional items that we agreed to do for the ship.

We added a couple of panels to block off areas so that the public cannot get behind some displays. It was decided to weld an angle iron combing around the bulkheads we erected to give them a more finished look. A general clean up was started in preparation for the dedication. Included in the clean up: polishing lockers and brass tags throughout the compartment. We decided to scrape and prime the deck to get it ready for the final painting. Believe me this was not something that was taken on without any thought as we knew it would be a lot of hard work. We all have the blisters, cuts and scrapes to prove it.



Section of deck that has been scraped and primed






# Off Site Work Going On.

#### Signs







Boxed Aircraft Liberty Ship, Note 4 hatches




Goal type post on Boxed Liberty Ship that has been scratch built for model.


## Crewmen Located 1,651 Located

## Radar Station Ship Is Given Title Guardian

#### First of Type, Vessel To Be Commissioned On Tuesday

The first Navy ocean radar station ship—the YAGR-1—was officially named yesterday. Navy Secretary Charles S. Thomas formally designated her the Guardian.

In announcing the names of the four new type vessels. Thomas cited them as "an essential factor to our national defense." The Guardian is the first Liberty ship to be converted as a radar station.

A sister ship to the Guardian, the YAGR3, currently is being converted at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth. She has been named the Skywatch. The other two radar-type vessels are being converted at the Charleston, S. C.; Naval Shipyard. They are the Lookout (YAGR2) and the Searcher (YAGR4).

The Guardian is scheduled for commissioning at the Portsmouth yard in special caremonies Tuescay. Completion of all four radar vessels is expected by May 1, a Navy spokesman said yesterday.

In a letter to the commanding officer of the Guardian, Lt. Robert E. Epilss, USN, Secretary Thomas emphasized the vital importance of the ship's role in national defense.

"The great import of your task and mission should be a challenge to you and the officers and men under your command, to establish and continue in the UIS YAGR-I these high standards and traditions of our Navy."
Euliss, who will officially as-

Euliss, who will officially assume command of the Guardian Tuesday, is a veteran of 25 years' Navy service. He entered the Navy in 1930 and worked his way to the top enlisted grade—chief petty officer quartermaster. Early in 1943 he was appointed

Early in 1943 he was appointed to the rank of warrant officer. Later that same year he was commissioned an ensign.

In 1944 he received a spot promotion to lieutenant and was assigned as commander of the LST-875. He commanded the ship during the Philippines and Okinawa campaigns.

He returned to East Coast duty



in 1947 and two years later took command of the LST-519. In 1952 he reported for duty with Fifth Naval District headquarters and

was assigned to the office of the reserve coordinator. He recently was selected for the rank of lieutenant commander.

Epiliss and his wife, Mary, live at 116 Burleigh Avenue. They have one son, Robert, Jr.

As you know the picket ships were noted for their sophisticated radar and communications equipment. Well we were having an exercise with the Air Force from McChord AFB out of Seattle, and after some time the aircraft asked our ship if we had him yet on the scope. We told him "no". After a few seconds went by, he asked again if we had him on our scope and our CIC told him "no". Our CIC asked him where he was and he said he was directly over the ship. So our equipment was not as great as we were told.

We were surprised one early morning by having a sailboat on our starboard beam just sitting there. She never showed up on our radar and the bridge watch never reported seeing the sailboat all night. After surrise the CO went to the side of the ship and asked the civilians on the sailboat what they wanted. They asked if we could spare them some napkins. The CO said "yes" and gave them the napkins. They then sailed off into the sea.

#### **Hat Orders**

The lapel pins are 5/8 inches long and in color.

YAGR'S logo pin is a new larger size pin (1 inch) than the previous one sold.

The USS SKYWATCHER AGR-3 and USS LOCATOR YAGR-6 ship emblem hat/lapel pins are in color and are 1 inch in diameter. These emblem pins are the first in a series that we hope to have available. As a note about the ship emblem pins: I have been told by a lot of you that you would buy pins for ships other than your own. If these pins do not sell, others will not be available! At the rate these pins are selling, other pins will not be available in the near future.

Please Note: Orders for hats and specialty devices must reach me by April 18, 2002. This is when orders will be placed with the suppliers. It can take up to six weeks after that for you to receive your order.
