Pre-Reunion Tour


Wednesday May 14, 2003

45 former crewmen have been added to our list since the last YAGRGRAM went out. If you have any information on former crewmen, get in touch with me.





All spouses/guests are invited to join us at the Saturday morning breakfast and penny social. This is a great way for the spouses/guests to meet one another while at the reunion.


We will also have a hat contest at this year's reunion. The theme is




YAGR'S Exhibit.

Onboard the Battleship Massachusetts

September 6, 7, 8, 2002 saw another group of YAGRMEN on board the Massachusetts. The first item we had to address was damage to one of the displays. Someone decided that they wanted the cigarette lighters that we have on display. First they tried to cut the 1/4 inch plexiglass; and when that didn't work, they heated up some kind of tool and tried to melt the plexiglass. Fourtunataly that didn't work either. To sum things up we replaced the damaged 1/4 inch plexiglass with 1/2 inch plexiglass. This will give an extra measure of security to the display. As a note in regard to the cigarette lighters, the Watchman is the only ship that does not have a lighter on display.

While on board, we held a field day of our exhibit, did some prep work for the future display of the ship plaques, commissioning pennants and flags. We installed a door in the forward bulkhead exhibit. For those of you who do not know, we (YAGR'S) have verteered our time to work on other projects on the battleship. At this time we are doing work in preparation of an exhibit that will be set up in the compartment forward of ours. This was why we installed the door.




FIFTEEN KNOT LIBERTY SHIP?

Stratford Morss (AGR-11, 1960-62)

PROTECTOR (AGR-11) sailed from Davisville In November for picket duty that included Thanksgiving at sea. The ship to return to Davisville just before Christmas. With the exception of the April 1961 at-sea period on Station 18 that unexpectedly resulted in a trip to the Florida Straits and Key West, this was the longest trip that I remember during my tour on PROTECTOR, June 1960 to June 1962.

At sea more than thirty days when relieved, we were all anxious to get home. Getting to know the ship a little better as the seasons advanced, I thought we might do better with deeper propeller submergence and transferred any remaining fuel from the 39 and 68 double bottoms to the 109 deep tanks. This gave us about an

eight foot trim by the stern.



I do not remember who relieved us, but I do remember Captain Noble's query as to "John's health" (the ship's engine), and was he up to the task of getting us home in good time for Christmas. When the word was passed the ship had been relieved, "Ahead Full", and 66 RPM was rung up. Soon the ship was doing the "66 Bounce". The count easily reached 76 RPM, design full power, and exceeded it.

We were rolling home and the weather was good, too good for the North Atlantic in mid-December. Captain Noble was watching every weather message on the board: a cor coastal storm was on its way up the coast.

Captain Noble's thoughts are paraphrased as: "If we get caught in what's coming, we'll be held outside until things clear and it'll be very close to Christmas before we could get in. I want to get in before the storm hits and I'll go in after dark, if necessary." In the meanwhile, "John" was whirling away at a steady 80 plus RPM.

MMC Preston was having fun. He opined that "John" could do

better with careful additional, but not excessive, oiling. BTC Lewandowski (an extrovert from Brooklyn) was willing to join the fray. His relief, BTC Stinson, on his first trip, was more cautious. All the Chiefs watched over and tended the plant together. Nothing was going to go wrong.

Sunday afternoon, in Block Island Sound, the turns mounted to 88. It was a sunny afternoon. I alternated between the engine room and the Bridge. Pennington, QMSN, was Quartermaster of the Watch and was taking hourly fixes on the Loran A in the Chart House. At 1400 he told me "15-4 knots last hour" Incredible! At 1500, it was "15.2 knots"

Forty-two years later, did tidal currents have anything to do with this feat? Absolutely not! Billions of trilobites had sacrificed themselves on the Babcock and Wilcox altar of pure power.

Two single screw 1006 Class DEs were coming up fast on the starboard quarter. Just astern, they slowed. Captain Noble was senior to both DE commanding officers.

"Request permission to proceed on duty assigned"

"Permission Granted." The DEs speeded up then slowed ahead broad on the starboard bow and both blew boiler tubes all over us. Fifteen knot AGR, indeed!

Sunset was around 1615 on December 20. PROTECTOR passed Brenton Reef after dark and was tied up at Davisville about 2000. It had started to snow. Captain Noble was right, as he always was regarding weather matters. The other AGRs did not come in until just before Christmas.

It snowed 20 inches in Davisville that storm. As CDO, I was in the Wardroom Monday morning when a large shape filled the door. CW02 Paul Hager, my new Main Propulsion Assistant, reported on board for duty. The 1947 Pacific Fleet Heavy Weight Boxing Champion, Paul had been one of my instructors at Underwater Swimmers School three and a half years earlier. But that is another chapter of my tour in the AGR "Blue Ribband of the Atlantic" winner, PROTECTOR.



The second item is a lapel/hat pin silhouette of a picket ship in color that is 1-1/2 inches long.
