

Post Reunion Cruise


Sunday May 22, 2005 two bus loads (105 people) of former picket ship crewmen and their guests departed the hotel for a short ride to pier 41 in San Francisco board the S.S. Jeremiah O'Brien for a day cruise on board her. All told the ship he over 900 people on board who signed up for the cruise.

Without a doubt, all who cruised on her had a enjoyable time. The weather couldn't have been better; the food and drink were great; and, for the west coast crewmen, it brought back memories of long ago as we passed under the Golden Gate Bridge. As

far as the east coast crewmen were concerned, passing under the bridge was something that one will never forget.

While the ship lay dead in the water, a memorial service was held by various groups, (YAGR'S included) to remember former crewmen and loved ones. Admiral Tom Patterson (AGR-1, 1954-56) senior officer onboard, and Tom Giardina (AGR-3, 1961-63), enlisted who was in uniform, had the honor of casting a wreath into the waters to honor all deceased YAGRMEN.










Lapel/hat pin silhouette of a picket ship is in color and is 1-1/2 inches long.
