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Washington, DC YAGR'S 12th Reunion

The official reunion dates are May 31, June 1 and June 2, 2007. Also to afford everyone an opportunity to see more of the area, we have set up pre-reunion tours on Tuesday, May 29 and Wednesday May, 30.

Make your room reservations call (800) 228-9290 or (703) 818-0300.

The room rate we negotiated is \$95.00 for a single or double room. This rate is good for May 28, 2007 to June 2, 2007, and for the 3 days after June 2nd on a very limited availability. Tell them you are with the YAGR'S group when making your room reservations to receive the special rate.

The hotel has a free shuttle that runs from the Dulles International Airport (this is the closest airport to the hotel). If you do not know, Washington, DC has two airports, Dulles and Reagan. Reagan is a distance from the Westfields Marriott. If at all possible get your flight into Dulles so that you will not have to pay for transportation from Reagan Airport to the hotel.

The reunion registration cost this year will be \$119.00 per person for those who have paid their dues and \$134.00 per person for those who have not paid their dues. You will notice the registration cost is higher than in the past. We have done everything to keep the cost as low as possible.

The room rate we have is a very good deal for a 4 star hotel. The parking is free and, as I said above, there is a free shuttle to and from Dulles airport.

We spent a lot of time negotiating these costs with the tour anies and the hotels we were looking at, and it was one of actors in our decision on the hotel and tour company we finally picked. We feel we got the best deal we could considering the area and time of year.

For those of you who have made your room resevations and are staying for the whole reunion, make sure you are checking out on the 3rd of June and not the 2nd.

The hotel has had some problems with the reservations. If you call and have a problem making your room reservations, give me a call right away (401) 724-7278. If you do have a problem, ask for the person's full name that you are talking to and also make a note of the time and day/date you called.



NOTE: The response for the reunion is running well ahead of our past reunions. We had to add hotel rooms for the 3 dates before the reunion, and the buses for the pretours are filling rapidly. What this all means is that if you plan to attend the reunion, don't wait too long before you sign up.

We don't want to turn people away because they did not sign up soon enough.

June 1, 2007

Group Tour 8:45 AM TO 4:45 PM

Our morning begins with a visit to the newly dedicated National World War II memorial honoring all military veterans of the war.

We continue on with a memorable visit to the nation's outstanding monuments to America's history: the Lincoln Memorial, honoring the man who saved the Union; the Vietnam War Memorial and the Korean War Memorial.

Next we visit Union Station. Following a two year restoration project, this site has indeed been recognized as one of the grandest train stations in the country. The location of spe-

cialty shops, restaurants and boutiques has been incorporinto the total ambience of this magnificent edifice. Time be allowed for "lunch on your own" among the myriad of eateries located at this site.

A highlight of this day will be a stop at the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial. Located directly across from the world famous Tidal Basin, the memorial features a park of granite walls, waterfalls and bronze sculptures that depict Roosevelt's presidency from 1933-1945.



Pre-Reunion Tours

Tuesday, May 29, 2007 Plaque Dedication, 9:45 AM - 3:45 PM \$20.00 per person

We will be dedicating a plaque honoring our ships at the US Navy Memorial in Washington, DC. Lee Doyel (AGR-15) has donated the funds for this plaque.

Buses will pick us up at the hotel for transportation to the ceremony at the U.S. Navy Memorial in Washington. We expect to have some free time in DC after the dedication before the bus trip back to our hotel.

We will be limited to those who wish to attend by the number of bus seats. I have reserved two buses and these could be filled well before the cut off date; so if you want to attend the dedication, make sure you sign up early.

The cut off date for signing up for both of the Pre-Reunion tours is April 1, 2007.

Wednesday, May 30, 2007 Annapolis and the Naval Academy, 8:30 AM – 4:15 PM \$65.00 per person

Annapolis has been called "the most perfect example of a colonial town existing today in America." Surprisingly little has changed since Maryland's capital was laid out in 1695. In fact, Annapolis has the greatest concentration of 18th century architecture to be found anywhere in the United States.

Upon arrival in Annapolis, we will be greeted by a local costumed docent who will guide us through the cobbles streets of this historic area, including the interior and extension of the Maryland State House, the oldest state house in continuous legislative use and the exterior of the many 17th and 18th century buildings and mansions in the area. We continue on to the United States Naval Academy, established in 1845 and covering more than 300 acres on the Severn River.

You will have time on your own for lunch and browsing throughout the waterfront area of the town where the elite of Annapolis dock their yachts and the many shops and boutiques located here.

You will need a picture ID for this tour.

Remember to bring the tickets that were sent to you for the pre-reunion tours. If you do not, you will have to wait and board the last bus to leave the hotel.

YAGR'S Exhibit

Battleship Massachusetts

Work has started on the existing peacoat lockers that we are modifying to show various items we have collected. Roland CAGR-10), John Hemminger (AGR-2) and Harry Miller (AGR-11) (YR-65) have been going on the ship each Wednesday to work on this new display.

The first step was to remove the existing covers to enable us to measure and fit the 3 plexiglass panels that will replace the covers. Once this was done, a frame was made to secure and frame each of the 3 panels.



Now we could concentrate on the interior framing and paneling needed to form the shelves. The existing lockers are built in 3 sections, each section the shape of a parallelogram and each being a different size.


After painting the interior panels, sides and shelves white, the next step was to pick out the color for and install the felt fabric that would line the bottom shelf.

We looked at a few colors, (blue, gold and gray) before deciding on gray.

Special Projects on the Battleship. Women In The Military

We are taking on another project for the Battleship, "Women Protecting US." This exhibit will be in the compartment july forward of our exhibit. It has been in the works for a while, but now things are moving along.

YAGR'S had a work weekend September 15, 16 and 17, 2006 with Don Batty (AGR-9), Roland Cote (AGR-10), John Hemminger (AGR-2), Henry MacKay (AGR-12) and Harry Miller (AGR-11) (YR-65) onboard.

The first task we tackled was cutting off all brackets and deck fittings that would impede the visitors while in the compartment. It was deja vu (just like the work we did when we started our exhibit) with all the grinding of welds flush with the deck, the grit and grime and the sore backs from all the bending over.
