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This YAGRGRAM is going out a little earlier than normal as I want to pass along some information. There is a very good chance that as we get closer to prereunion tour cutoff dates, we will not be able to get any more buses. This means that if you wait too long, there could be a problem with any tours you want to go on even if you get your reservation in by the cutoff dates. Also, if you sign up for these tours, I am asking that you send a separate check for each tour: \$20.00 per " "son for the plaque dedication and "0 per person for the Annapolis tour."

Secondly, we have added numerous rooms to the reserved block of rooms we had set aside for YAGR'S. If you plan to go to the reunion, sign up as early as possible so you won't be disappointed.

Your reunion registration fee covers the hospitality room (light snacks and beverages), group tour on Friday (June 1), the spouses/guests Saturday breakfast and penny social, coffee at the mens meeting, the Saturday night banquet and all tips.

As a final note, men usually wear a sport jacket or suit (some men wear their uniforms), and the women a dress or suit to the Saturday night banquet.

The official reunion dates are May 31, June 1 and June 2, 2007. Also to afford everyone an opportunity to see more of the area, we have set up optional pre-reunion tours on Tuesday, May 29 and Wednesday, May 30.

The room rate we negotiated is \$95.00 for a single or double room. This rate is good for May 28, 2007 to June 2, 2007, and for the 3 days after June 2 on a very limited availability. Tell them you are with the YAGR'S group when making your room reservations to receive the special rate.

The hotel has a free shuttle that runs from the Dulles International Airport (this is the closest airport to the hotel). Washington, DC has two airports, Dulles and Reagan. Reagan is a distance from the Westfields Marriott. If at all possible get your flight into Dulles so that you will not have to pay for transportation from Reagan Airport to the hotel.

The reunion registration cost this year will be \$119.00 per person for those who have paid their dues and \$134.00 per person for those who have not paid their dues.

Transportation from Dulles International Airport (IAD) to the Westfields Marriott is complimentary. Hotel shuttles pick-up only on demand so you need to call the hotel in advance to arrange for a pick-up time. When making your pick up reservation, please supply the following information: name, date, airline, flight number and time of arrival. Once the reservation is made, the shuttle will be available on the hour and the half-hour (i.e. 10:30, 11:00) closest to your arrival time. The pick-up area is curbside 2H outside of baggage claim. There are multiple Marriott Hotels that utilize 2H so you should ensure that you wait for the Westfields Marriott shuttle.

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The hotel has had some problems with the reservations. If you call and have a problem making your room reservations, give me a call right away (401) 724-7278. If you do have a problem, ask for the person's full name that you are talking to and also make a note of the time and day/date you called.

The cost of this tour is included with your reunion registration fee.

Our morning begins with a visit to the newly dedicated National World War II memorial honoring all military veterans of the war.

We continue on with a memorable visit to the nation's outstanding monuments to America's history: the Lincoln Memorial, honoring the man who saved the Union; the Vietnam War Memorial and the Korean War Memorial.

Next we visit Union Station. Following a two-year restoration project, this site has indeed been recognized as one of the grandest train stations in the country. The location of specialty shops, restaurants and boutiques has been incorporated into the total ambience of this magnificent edifice. Time will be allowed for "lunch on your own" among the myriad of eateries located at this site.

A highlight of this day will be a stop at the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial. Located directly across from the world famous Tidal Basin, the memorial features a park of granite walls, waterfalls and bronze sculptures that depict Roosevelt's presidency from 1933-1945.

We will be dedicating a plaque honoring our ships at the US Navy Memorial in Washington, DC. Lee Doyel (AGR-15) has donated the funds for this plaque.

Buses will pick us up at the hotel for transportation to the ceremony at the U.S. Navy Memorial in Washington. We expect to have some free time in DC after the dedication before the bus trip back to our hotel.

We will be limited to those who wish to attend by the number of bus seats. I have reserved three buses and these could be filled well before the cut off date; so if you want to attend the dedication, make sure you sign up early.

The cut off date for signing up for both of the Pre-Reunion tours is April 1, 2007.

Wednesday, May 30, 2007

Annapolis and the Naval Academy, 8:30 AM – 4:15 PM \$65.00 per person

Annapolis has been called "the most perfect example of a colonial town existing today in America." Surprisingly little has changed since Maryland's capital was laid out in 1695. In fact, Annapolis has the greatest concentration of 18th century architecture to be found anywhere in the United States.

Upon arrival in Annapolis, we will be greeted by a local costumed docent who will guide us through the cobblestone streets of this historic area, including the interior and exterior of the Maryland State House, the oldest state house in continuous legislative use and the exterior of the many 17th and 18th century buildings and mansions in the area. We continue on to the United States Naval Academy, established in 1845 and covering more than 300 acres on the Severn River.


You will have time on your own for lunch and browsing throughout the waterfront area of the town where the elite of Annapolis dock their yachts and the many shops and boutiques located here.


# Saturday Breakfast and Penny Social/Raffle

U.S. Civil War (34 stars) 1861-1863







# Special Projects Battleship Massachusetts

We have been working on the new exhibit "Women Protecting US" onboard the Battleship Massachusetts. While this 15 a single exhibit, we are treating it as two projects. One is fabricating two ladders and a booby hatch. The ladders are needed for a second means of egress out of the space. One ladder will go from the exhibit area to a half deck above it, where then the second ladder will lead up to the main deck. On the main deck the booby hatch will be fabricated. We are actually creating a new entrance/exit to the forward area of the ship. It should be noted that this work will benefit our exhibit by creating a new visitors route that will take them directly through our exhibit.

The second project is the actual building of the exhibit display structures. This work encompasses building frame work between existing stanchions (columns) and then adding trim pieces that will act as a frame for the plexiglass viewing panels (windows).

We had a work weekend January 19 - 20, 2007 where Jack Floyd (AGR-11) (YR-65), Tom Giardina (AGR-3), John Hemminger (AGR-2), Henry MacKay (AGR-12) and Harry Miller (AGR-11) (YR-65) worked on the display structures.













### **YAGR'S Dues**
